




# SR-5/US-1 Resurfacing, Rehabilitation and Restoration Project

## PROJECT FACT SHEET

### Limits:

Along SR-5/US-1 north of SE 17th Street to south of the Henry E. Kinney Tunnel

### Project Description:

The purpose of the SR-5/US-1 project is as follows:

1. Milling/resurfacing/restriping and safety improvements throughout project limits.
2. Roadway median landscape improvements.
3. Add a 5-foot cast-in-place raised concrete sidewalk with a 32-inch vertical traffic railing and pedestrian/bicycle railing on the Tarpon River Bridge.
4. Cover utility strips with concrete to create wider sidewalks.
5. Upgrade spanwire signalization system to a mast arm system and upgrade crosswalk to stamped asphalt crosswalk at SR-5/US-1 and SE 7th Street intersection.
6. Pedestrian curbramps not meeting ADA criteria will be upgraded as well as all objects within control zone will be relocated to improve the safety of the traveling public.
7. Four unused driveways have been identified along the corridor. Identified driveways will be investigated for removal through the "Driveway Closure Notification Form."
8. Add offset median left turn lanes at SE 13th Street median opening to improve visibility and reduce left turn head on collisions as per FDOT Safety Report.
9. Add 4 foot concrete traffic separator at SR-5/US-1 (Northbound) and SE 6th Street intersection to eliminate illegal right turn movements from SE 6th Street onto SR-5/US-1 to access the Henry E. Kinney Tunnel.
